Imagine the roads and tracks of mediæval Europe thronged with travellers, some of whom were pilgrims on the way to a site where they would seek restoration of spiritual or physical health. Some travelled for themselves, others journeyed for those incapable of such an undertaking. This course will consider some early pilgrimage sites as well as the planning of pilgrimage churches at home and abroad, for saints were both national and international. Two of England's most important pilgrimage sites were in East Anglia: there was the famous Marian shrine at Walsingham, and the martyred king St Edmund lay at Bury St Edmunds – or did he?
